

Understand Course Entry and Visa Requirements

To get started, choose a course that aligns with your career goals and make sure you meet the entry requirements. You'll need to have completed Year 12 (or an equivalent qualification) and meet all other listed criteria. If you're an international student, you must also satisfy the visa requirements before applying. For full details, visit the Department of Home Affairs website.

Choose Your Course and Enrol

Select your preferred course and complete the enrolment form on our website. International students must also provide required documents (e.g., notarised passport, birth certificate, academic qualifications) and pay the application fee. After applying, you'll be invited for an enrolment interview and may be asked to complete a Core Skills Indicator assessment to help us assess your learning and technical skills for the course.

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Confirmation of Enrolment and OSHC

If you are accepted into the course, you will receive a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) from us. International students must first complete and return the Offer and Acceptance form. You'll also need to purchase Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC). Once we receive your signed form, payment, and OSHC details, we will issue your CoE, which you'll need to apply for your student visa.

Apply for Your Student Visa

Gather all required documents and lodge your student visa application — either through an agent or by yourself, online or in person. Processing times can vary, so it's best to apply as soon as you receive your CoE.

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Organise Your Flight and Move to Melbourne

Once your visa is approved, start planning your move! Send us your flight details at least one week in advance so we can welcome you at the airport and help you settle in.


PAYEMENT OF FEES

ACCEPTANCE INTO AN APPROVED COURSE

Oxford College Australia is a CRICOS-approved provider (04244C), authorised to enrol international students. To apply for an Australian student visa, you must first be accepted into one of our CRICOS-approved courses. Students from certain countries must also meet English language requirements, typically an IELTS Academic score of 5.5 or equivalent (lower scores may be accepted with ELICOS programs — contact us for details).

FINANCIAL REQUIREMENTS

You must have sufficient funds to cover your living, travel, and tuition costs in Australia, especially if required by your visa conditions. According to the Department of Home Affairs, you should budget AUD\$21,041 for 12 months of living expenses. If you are bringing a partner or spouse, you'll need an additional AUD\$7,362, and for a child, an extra AUD\$3,152.

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YOU ARE A GENUINE TEMPORARY ENTRANT

You must be able to show that your intentions in Australia are temporary and for the purpose of study. Refer to our Genuine Temporary Entrant statement info sheet to find out what you should include in your statement of purpose.

GOOD HEALTH AND CHARACTER

Some applicants may need to provide the Department of Home Affairs with a police clearance certificate to demonstrate good character. In some cases, applicants may also be required to complete a medical examination to confirm they are in good health.

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OVERSEAS STUDENT HEALTH COVER (OSHC)

All international students are required to hold an OSHC policy while studying in Australia, unless they are citizens of Belgium or Norway. Students from Sweden who have health insurance through CSN International or Kammarkollegiet are also exempt. Oxford College Australia can assist you in comparing and purchasing the required OSHC — speak to us today!



FAQs

What payment methods are available?

Payment methods include bank transfer, or credit / debit card. A 3.5% surcharge applies if paying via an international credit / debit card.

When do I pay?

Fees are due when you receive your acceptance offer or letter or invoice for your fees. Fees are to be paid upfront unless the student has been put on a full written, 7-day extension (maximum), granted from Oxford College Australia, unless otherwise advised.

You should make your fee payment (and / or enrolment acceptance) before class commencement date. If not, Oxford College Australia may cancel your enrolment or refuse to provide access to learning and assessment resources. Should you have difficulty paying your fees by the due date, please speak to our Student and Administration Support Manager to discuss any flexible payment options that may be available for your circumstance.

How do I set up a payment plan?

Should you wish to set up a payment plan, please speak with our Student and Administration Support Manager to discuss the possibility of a payment plan.

If a student is offered a payment plan and the student fails to meet the agreed payment plan terms, they may not be considered for subsequent payment plans. This may also be considered a breach of agreement and may be subject to cancellation. Failure to meet the payment plan, may result in the suspension of your student visa.

Do I pay GST in my tuition fees?

No – training tuition fees are GST exempt under section 38-B5 GSTR 2001/1 (Goods and Services Tax ruling). The ruling explains the supply of a course for 'professional or trade course' is GST- free. GST does apply to the cost of miscellaneous charges.

Responsibility for training quality

Oxford College Australia is responsible under the National Code of Practice for Providers of Education and Training to Overseas Students 2018 and the Standards for RTOs 2015 for the quality of the training and assessment provided. OCA is also responsible for the issuance of the Student Handbook and Certificate.

Tuition Assurance policy for International Students

Oxford College Australia is a CRICOS Registered RTO and is covered by the Australian Government's Tuition Protection Service (TPS). The Tuition Protection Service ensures your fees are protected and offers support if your education provider closes. Can I get a refund?

For local students: Students who give notice to cancel their enrolment 10 business days or more prior to the commencement of a program, will be entitled to a full refund. Students who give notice to cancel their enrolment 9 business days or less prior to the commencement of a program will be entitled to a 75% refund of tuition fees paid. Students who withdraw within 10 business days of the course commencing, will be entitled to a 50% refund. Students who withdraw more than 10 business days after the course commences, are not entitled to a refund. Students who purchase and withdraw after 10 business days after the course has commenced their training will not be entitled to a refund for any of their units.

If a student is issued / has purchased a text, workbook, tools or learning materials, OCA does not refund the monies for them.

How do I get a refund?

To obtain a refund you are required to complete the Deferral, Suspension or Withdrawal form. If your deferral, suspension or withdrawal request is approved, you will be sent a Payment Refund Application Form to complete. Paid via electronic funds transfer using the authorised bank account. Refunds will be made in the same currency you paid your tuition fees unless this is not possible. All refunds are paid to the person who enters into the contract with OCA and approved within 10 working days from the time your refund request is approved.

Our guarantee to you


If, for any reason, Oxford College Australia is unable to fulfil our service agreement with a student, Oxford College Australia will refund the full fees paid.
